

# BULK PACKAGE MARKINGS

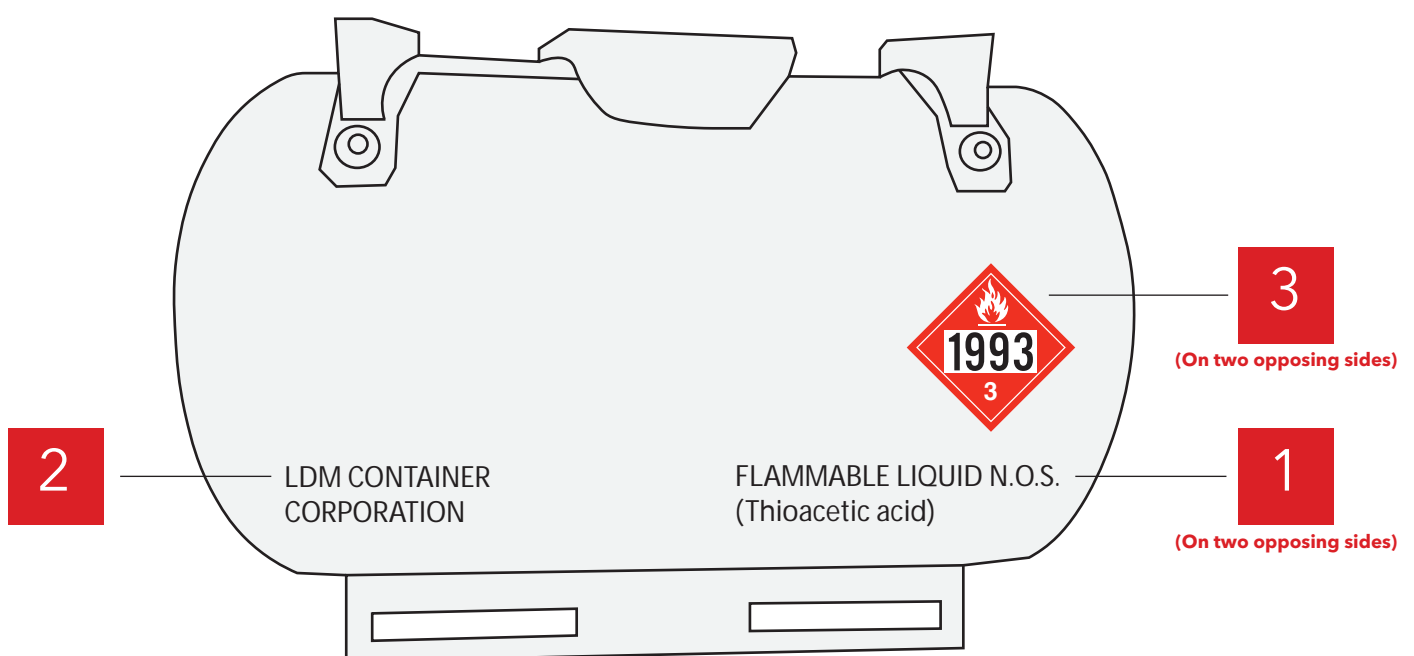
## Bulk Packaging is defined as a package with:

A maximum capacity greater than 119 gallons (450 L) as a receptacle for a liquid,

A maximum net mass greater than 882 pounds (400 kg) and a maximum capacity greater than 119 gallons (450 L) as a receptacle for a solid, or

A water capacity greater than 1000 pounds (454 kg) as a receptacle for a gas

## Example of bulk package marking requirements:



### 1. Proper Shipping Name -

Unless excepted, portable tanks must be marked on two opposing sides with the proper shipping name. Cargo tanks transporting Class 2 materials must display the proper shipping name or common name on all 4 sides.

### 2. Owner's Name -

The owner or lessee's name, as appropriate, must be displayed on portable tanks.

### 3. Identification Number -

Portable tanks under 1,000-gallon capacity must be marked with the ID number on two opposing sides. Portable tanks with a 1,000-gallon capacity or more must be marked with the ID number on all 4 sides. Cargo tanks must display the ID number on all 4 sides.
