

MARINE POLLUTANTS MARKING






Each side of the marking must be at least 3.9 inches (100 mm) for non-bulk packages and bulk packages with a capacity of less than 1,000 gallons (3,785 L). For bulk packages with a capacity of 1,000 gallons or more, each side of the marking must be at least 9.8 inches (250 mm).




Non-bulk packages containing marine pollutants transported by vessel must be marked with:


- UN identification number,
- Proper shipping name and marine pollutant name (if required), and
- Marine pollutant mark in association with applicable hazard warning label(s).



Bulk packages containing marine pollutants transported by vessel must be marked with the marine pollutant marking on:



- All 4 sides for packages with a capacity of 1,000 gallons (3,785 L) or more, and
- Two opposing sides for packages with a capacity of less than 1,000 gallons (3,785 L).



The marine pollutant marking is NOT required on:

- Non-bulk packages transported by highway, rail, or air,
- Packages displaying the limited quantity marking,
- On single or combination packages where each single package or each inner package of combination package does not exceed 1.3 gallons (5 L) for liquids or 11 pounds (5 kg) for solids, or
- Bulk packages transported by highway, rail, or air when a label or placard is displayed.
